Throughout March, there will continue to be Lenten Coin Holders sitting on the table in the entryway. The school needs more Small Catechisms, as well as school supplies for the kids.

Adult Bible Class: The Book of Genesis

Pastor's Page

Fear Not, Little Flock

My friends, as most of you know, a few weeks ago I received a Divine Call to serve as pastor at St. John Lutheran Church and School in Grand Haven, MI. As I write this, I am currently still in the "Deliberation" phase of the Call process. As it stands, right now I have two calls, both of which are from God: To serve you at St. Mark's and to serve St. John in Grand Haven. My duty as a pastor, therefore, is to gather information and to decide between these two Calls, asking, "What would be best for God's Kingdom and for my family?"

Now, given the circumstances, I can think of no better message for this Pastor's Page than to share with you these words of Jesus, by which He speaks comfort to His Church, no matter what: "Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32).

Do you hear that? Here, Jesus reminds you of a beautiful reality. It is your Father's good pleasure to give you the Kingdom. You, O little flock—God delights to give you the Kingdom! He rejoices to give it to you! He takes the highest, heavenly pleasure in giving it to you! Jesus Your Savior has secured the Kingdom for you with His precious blood. In His sacrifice, the doors are open, which had been closed by Your sin. And now God delights to give it to you as a free gift through faith. He doesn't give you the Kingdom begrudgingly. We don't have to twist His arm. No, just like a father who delights to give gifts to His children, so it is God's delight to give you His Kingdom, for in Christ, He is your heavenly Father. Indeed, in Baptism the Kingdom of God is already yours.

And what a joy this is! After all, consider what it means for God to give you the Kingdom. This means eternal life. This means the forgiveness of your sins. This means the resurrection from the dead. This means the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and peace with your Creator. This means seeing God face-to-face. This means a reunion with all who have died in faith and an existence free from pain, grief, or tears that will last forever. This is the joy of the Kingdom. And here Jesus assures you: This Kingdom is yours, no matter what, as a free gift through faith, for your heavenly Father loves to give it to you. What an amazing thing to hear!

And so it is that Jesus says to you, "Fear not, little flock." No matter what may happen in the days ahead. No matter what challenges you may face. Fear not! Jesus will be by your side to care for you on the way. He will be there to strengthen and sustain you with His Word and Sacraments. And when you reach the end of your journey through this fallen world in faith, you will find open doors to heaven.

And so I say to you: You have no reason to fear, O little flock—no matter what! You can continue in love. You can continue in joy. You can continue in generous service to your neighbors. For you have all you need, and more. Your sins are forgiven. Your Shepherd is with you. The Kingdom is Yours! So fear not, little flock! After all, it is your Father's good pleasure to give it all to you.




Church volunteers are needed

Council Meeting Minutes - Summarized January 17, 2023

Attendees: Pastor Vergin, Tom LoCascio, Karen Kaufman, Jim O'Brien, John Reardon, Lori Whitehead, Kyle Albert, and Nancy McInnis

Call to order at 7:00 pm. Opening Prayer and Devotion by Pastor: Romans 12:3-8.

Tom LoCascio welcomed Kyle Albert to the Council and welcomed back John Reardon and Lori Whitehead.

Previous minutes were presented by Nancy and approved.

Pastor's Report per Pastor Vergin -

- Ash Wednesday Soup & Salad Supper on February 22 with Divine Service at 7 pm.
- Transfiguration Sunday is January 29.
- Pastor Pies filling in on February 19 because Pastor Vergin was asked (by the District) to perform an ordination in Brighton that morning. The District will cover Pastor Pies' preaching expense.
- Midweek Lent Services Some of our circuit pastors, along with Pastor Vergin, will be doing a round-robin schedule of preaching

Treasurer's Report per Kyle Albert – distributed the December 2022 report. The total income for 2022 was \$149,693. This is a bit more than expected. Total expenses were about \$2,400 over what was budgeted.

Financial Secretary's Report per Lori Whitehead – no report. Pastor did state that we are very thankful for the car sale donation of \$13,000 and that it was a gift from Heaven.

Tom distributed the Parish Report and February's Church Calendar. Pastor noted that Men's Bible Study will be moved to February 11. On the Parish Report, Tom noted that our Worship Attendance and our Communion Attendance went down a bit from 2021. Kyle noted that the reduced attendance didn't seem to affect our donations. Pastor stated that the beginning of 2022 was rough as far as church attendance, but believes that we are heading in a good trajectory now by the Grace of God.

Properties per Jim O'Brien -

- Toilet paper dispensers: "ordered, delivered, installed, enjoy".
- We have Icon Restoration coming out to give us an estimate on the siding that fell off during a windstorm

- last month to see if it can be replaced. Jim is looking at this as an insurance claim so the deductible (\$1,000) will apply.
- Parking lot crack repair we received four bids last year and these will be followed up on in the Spring.
- Lobby update no plans ready at this time.
 - a. Tom Kaufman has an idea for the flooring and hopefully can get us a quote on that.
 - b. Karen Kaufman spoke with Pastor about some banners to hang.
 - c. We need a quote on painting and would like a high top table and a couple chairs in case folks need to sit down.
 - d. Pastor suggested that the Lobby Improvement Committee get together after Bible study to finish planning the improvements.
- Per Tom, a couple indoor lights are out. Per Jim, we need to purchase more as we're out of them.

NEW BUSINESS

Council signed a thank you letter to the person who donated the proceeds of a car they sold.

Financial Matters: Budget Planning and Financial Reviews -

A discussion occurred regarding budget planning and also Council's reviewing of St. Mark's finances. Several suggestions were made including:

- Council should use the Budget Planning guidelines offered by the Michigan District in the Treasurer's Manual.
- Add an item beneath New Business each month called "Financial Review", or something similar, that would allow a more in-depth discussion of St. Mark's finances.
- Position the "Financial Review" item on the Agenda after the *Financial Secretary's Report*. Only add it quarterly to Council's quarterly <u>Business Meeting Agenda</u> as the Business Meetings are when Council focuses more on finances and less on all other ministries. Then if, after a few months, Council feels that quarterly financial reviews are not serving us well, the "Financial Review" item can be added to the non-quarterly Ministries' Council meeting agendas, as well.
- A Budget Committee Per our bylaws, the budget should be created collaboratively between the Treasurer and

Financial Secretary with the assistance of our Pastor, President and Vice President. A Budget Committee should be appointed in September 2023 to create 2024's budget. Tom suggested that Jim O'Brien be part of the committee.

- Take the money out of our checking account and put in an account that earns interest.
- Have this fall's newly-appointed Budget Committee take a look at ALL our finances including the investment accounts.
- Shop around for office and church supplies to see if we can get cheaper prices.

Per Pastor: A man named Bill Hess contacted Pastor regarding a government grant available to us due to the Coronavirus Pandemic. Bill said his company would help us get the grant and then they would take 15% of whatever we receive. (The amount of the grant for us wouldn't be much because we only have 2 full-time workers.) Per Council, Pastor should discuss the grant with Bill Hess just to see how much we qualify for.

Next Council meeting: Tuesday, February 21, 2023, at 7 pm. Meeting adjourned at 7:58 pm. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.
