## Lenten Coins will help support Ziah Town Lutheran School, Liberia

In February, you might notice some Lenten Coin Holders sitting on the table in the entryway. The way these work is that if you place a quarter in one of the slots each day during Lent (excluding the Sundays in Lent which are IN Lent, but not OF Lent), you will have \$10 by Easter Sunday. (You may also choose to write a check made payable to St. Mark's Lutheran Church, or place cash in the coin holder instead of filling it with quarters.) Full coin holders can then be placed in the offering plates on Easter Sunday and these donations will be sent to Joe Boway in support of the Ziah Town Lutheran School in Liberia, Africa. The school needs more Large Catechisms, as well as school supplies for the kids.

As Christians, it's important that we study God's Word as often as possible. Daily devotions, weekly church services and weekly Bible Studies help us learn more about God's plan for us, and also helps to strengthen our Christian faith. St. Mark's offers the following opportunities for you to delve further into God's holy Word.

### Adult Bible Class: The Book of Genesis

In the month of February, we will be continuing our study of the book of Genesis in our Adult Bible Class!

The book of Genesis is the first book of the Bible, and it tells the story of God's salvation from the very beginning. It starts with the creation of the world and the fall into sin, and from there it traces the promise of the Savior from generation to generation, beginning with Adam and culminating with Jacob's twelve children. It includes the account of Noah and the Flood, the Tower of Babel, the Call of Abraham, and Joseph's rise in Egypt. At every place it proclaims the steadfast love of God and His faithfulness in redeeming mankind from the guilt of our sin.

We hope you will join us for this study! This is a great opportunity to fill your week with God's Word and to grow in knowledge and faith!

## The Bible's Teaching on Love

My friends, once again we find ourselves entering that time of year when the world talks a lot about love. You've probably noticed it. Bags of candy placed prominently on store shelves, within easy reach of both parents and children alike. Flowers moved near the checkout aisles. Cards set on display by the entryways. The color pink on every package. And one word emblazoned, explicitly or implicitly, upon it all: LOVE. Yeah, Valentine's Day is upon us. A time when the world talks a lot about love.

But so does the Bible—and not just in one place or at one time, but from beginning to end. This is, in fact, the central message of the Scriptures. It's all about love, both the love of God and the love of His people. So, at this time of year, as this particular word swirls incessantly all around us, I want to ask: What does the Bible teach us about love? And how does this compare to the teaching of the world?

Now, to do this, I think one of the best places to look is actually the book of 1 John. Here, the Apostle John is writing to the Church-at-large, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. And as he does, he has a lot to say about love. In fact, in this little letter, made up of only 5 chapters, the word "love" is used 46 times. Indeed, John here wraps up the entire Biblical teaching of love succinctly and beautifully.

So what does this letter teach us about love?

First, John teaches that *love begins with God and His giving of His only Son for our salvation*. "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins" (1 John 4:10). It's here that we truly see what love is. According to the Bible, love is more than just the sappy, sentimental emotion which fills the month of February. Rather, it is a selfless orientation toward another, which seeks the other's good, prioritizes the other, cherishes the other, and is embodied in real self-sacrifice. It is a God who gives up His only begotten Son to save poor wretched sinners from the death that they deserved. "In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him" (1 John 4:9). And it is this very Son laying down His life, even for His persecutors. "By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us" (1 John 3:16a).

Here, in the cross of Jesus, we see what love really is. And we rejoice to be the beneficiaries of it, for it means our salvation through faith. Indeed, by the surpassing love of God, we are now His children in Christ. "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God" (1 John 3:1a). And so it is that we can say with confidence and with the highest joy, "God is love" (1 John 4:16b).

But then what happens? *When we come to believe in this saving love of God in Christ, we will love our brothers, for the love of God will abide in us*. God's love becomes our motivation to love. "We love because he first loved us" (1 John 4:19). This is the natural and righteous response of His children. "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another" (1 John 4:11). The same selfless, unconditional love that we have received from God, we then show to our brothers.

First, this means loving our brothers in the faith, our fellow believers. "Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the Father loves whoever has been born of him" (1 John 5:1). But it also extends to our brothers according to the flesh, all mankind, though it excludes an idolatrous love for worldly things. "Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him" (1 John 2:15). By the love of God, we are transformed in love and empowered in love. This love will then be perfected in us on the day of the Son's appearing, when at last "we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is" (1 John 3:2b).

In this way, *through our love we show ourselves, even now, to be of God*. "Whoever loves his brother abides in the light, and in him there is no cause for stumbling" (1 John 2:10). "We know that we have passed out of death into life, because we love the brothers" (1 John 3:14a). "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God" (1 John 4:7). Our love is the outward evidence of our adoption by grace.

But, of course, the converse is also true: "By this it is evident who are the children of God, and who are the children of the devil: whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is the one who does not love his brother" (1 John 3:10). "Anyone who does not love does not know God,

because God is love" (1 John 4:8). "If anyone says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1 John 4:20). "But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?" (1 John 3:17). Those who do not love are not of God, no matter what they might say.

Indeed, love is now God's commandment to us, His children. "And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother" (1 John 4:21). "And this is his commandment, that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us" (1 John 3:23). "For this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another" (1 John 3:11). But to love in this way means more than just words: "Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth" (1 John 3:18).

So, my friends, as the world talks about love, especially this month, remember what the Bible says. Don't limit love to the sappy emotionalism of the holiday. But let it stand in its fullness as revealed in the cross of Jesus. And having thus received God's love for you, let that perfect love transform you and motivate you to love one another, not just in February, but every day, both now and forevermore.

Since St. Mark's Board of Parish Fellowship will be serving the Lenten Dinner on Ash Wednesday from 5:45 - 6:45 p.m., please note the dinner and Bible lesson times for our youth program that evening will switch too. On February 22, the Wednesday Nights in Christ program will begin with the Bible lesson first from 5:15 - 5:45, and then the Soup/Salad Supper will follow from 5:45 - 6:45. Our Board of Parish Fellowship will also be serving pizza for any kids that aren't crazy about soup or salad.

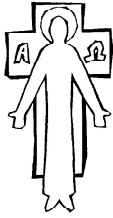


## Quilting Bee will resume on February 2
