

# Bible Study



## The Bible was written for our instruction

As it says in Romans 15:4: *For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.* The Bible was written for our instruction and to give us hope. Therefore, we need to be reading the scriptures daily and attending additional Bible studies as often as possible. Toward that end, St. Mark's offers the following opportunities to study our Lord's Words:

### Adult Bible Class: The Book of Genesis

In the month of June, we will be continuing our study of the book of Genesis in our Adult Bible Class!

The book of Genesis is the first book of the Bible, and it tells the story of God's salvation from the very beginning. It starts with the creation of the world and the fall into sin, and from there it traces the promise of the Savior from generation to generation, beginning with Adam and culminating with Jacob's twelve children. It includes the account of Noah and the Flood, the Tower of Babel, the Call of Abraham, and Joseph's rise in Egypt. At every place it proclaims the steadfast love of God and His faithfulness in redeeming mankind from the guilt of our sin.

We hope you will join us for this study! This is a great opportunity to fill your week with God's Word and to grow in knowledge and faith!

Adult Bible Class meets on Sundays at 10:45 a.m., after our Divine Service.

### Children's Sunday School

Weekly Sunday School for kids at St. Mark's takes place each Sunday morning from 10:45 - 11:45 a.m. in the upstairs youth room behind the choir loft. ## The Joy of Jesus' Ascension

My friends, of all the great moments in salvation history, the Ascension of our Lord must be one of the most underappreciated. How often do we forget that Jesus is not just crucified and risen, but also that He is now ascended to the right hand of the Father? In fact, from time to time we even hear of people imagining that the ascension is just another way of speaking of the resurrection. I remember a news article that was published a while back that said, "Jesus ascended from the dead." How sad it is that this point of faith has been so dramatically deemphasized among us, that many don't even know what it means!

We hear the account told clearly in the book of Acts, chapter 1: "And when [Jesus] had said these things, as [the disciples] were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight" (Acts 1:9).

Pretty clear, right? Here, forty days after His resurrection from the dead, Jesus was bodily lifted up before the eyes of his disciples. He rose up higher and higher into the sky until he was hidden behind a cloud. From that point onward, although Jesus is still with His Church always (Matthew 28:20), His presence among us is now hidden. We don't see Him like the disciples did in the days of His public ministry. He has now ascended into heaven.

Now, at first glance, we might wonder why this is a moment worth celebrating. After all, wouldn't it be better if we could still see Jesus with our earthly eyes? Here it's worth unpacking what the Bible says about the benefits of the ascension. Speaking broadly, there are three.

*First, Jesus' ascension means that our crucified Savior—a true man—now reigns over all heaven and earth for our sake.* Yeah, it's true that according to His divine nature, Jesus has always reigned over all things. From eternity past through the days of the prophets unto His incarnation, baptism, and passion, Jesus has always reigned as God. However, in His ascension, Jesus received this authority also according to His human nature. As He says, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Matthew 28:18). That is to say, Jesus now reigns over all things as a human being!

And what does that mean? It means that we don't need to be afraid of anything. Even when our life seems out of control, even when it looks like the church is failing, even when all seems to have devolved into chaos and disorder, we can be sure that Christ our brother is still reigning over it all. Nothing is outside of His control and authority. He knows what it's like to be tempted. He knows what it's like to suffer. He loves us even to the point of death on a cross. And now He is seated at

God's right hand, directing all things for the good of His Church. What a glorious comfort this should give to us!

But even more, *Jesus' ascension means that our own ascension is guaranteed.* Jesus is the head of His Church. And we are His body. Therefore, when we see Him ascending into the presence of the Father, we can be sure that we too will one day ascend. Right now, we live in a world of trial and tribulation. Here we face pain. Here we face sorrow. Here we face darkness. But as those who belong to Christ, we can be sure that the day will come when we too will ascend. Christ taught that this will happen on the Day of His return in glory: "If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:3). We know the day of our ascension is coming; our ascension is guaranteed. For Christ Himself is ascended to the presence of God.

And, lastly, *Jesus' ascension means that He now intercedes for us continually before the Father.* In this life, we desperately need God's mercy. Daily, we face troubles that are beyond our power to handle. And daily we sin against God and make ourselves worthy of condemnation. What a comfort it is, then, to know that Christ is at the Father's side, interceding for us day and night! Even when our prayers fail and falter, we know that Jesus is there, praying for us. He is pleading to God for mercy. And we know that the Father will hear the voice of His Son, whom He loves.

These are the great blessings of Christ's ascension. But how, therefore, should we live? The account of the ascension in the book of Acts gives us the answer: "While they were gazing into heaven as [Jesus] went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven'" (Acts 1:10-11).

Did you see that? Even as they beheld this great moment, the disciples were not to stand idly by, waiting for Christ's return with mouths open and eyes set toward heaven. Instead, even as they wait, they are to drop their eyes and get about the work of the Church. As Jesus had told them just before He departed: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). In other words, while Jesus reigns in heaven, we go about our work on earth. The ascension of Jesus doesn't remove from us our Christian duties; it empowers us to fulfill them!

## Vacation Bible School planning, prayers and door offerings continue


