

Adult Bible Class: The Book of Genesis

In the month of September, we will be continuing our study of the book of Genesis in our Adult Bible Class! The book of Genesis is the first book of the Bible, and it tells the story of God's salvation from the very beginning. It starts with the creation of the world and the fall into sin, and from there it traces the promise of the Savior from generation to generation, beginning with Adam and culminating with Jacob's twelve children. It includes the account of Noah and the Flood, the Tower of Babel, the Call of Abraham, and Joseph's rise in Egypt. At every place it proclaims the steadfast love of God and His faithfulness in redeeming mankind from the guilt of our sin.

Tranquility in the Storm: The Blessed Life of God's Church

My friends, toward the end of the book of Acts, we encounter a remarkable and striking scene. Here, Paul and his companions are on a ship, sailing across the Mediterranean Sea, heading to Rome. Some time earlier, Paul had been arrested in Jerusalem and in the course of his trial had appealed to Caesar—a right that belonged to every Roman citizen (Acts 25:11). Therefore, Paul was placed aboard a ship along with many other prisoners to sail to the capital city and await his chance to stand before the empire's highest official.

However, after they had begun their voyage, while they were sailing along the island of Crete, a great storm unexpectedly bore down upon them (Acts 27:14). For fourteen days this storm raged, battering the ship and driving it wildly across the sea. Desperately, the sailors did all they could to keep the ship afloat and avoid a wreck. They wrapped extra supports around the ship (Acts 27:17). They jettisoned the cargo (Acts 27:18). They even cast off the ship's tackle (Acts 27:19). But at last, after many days, "all hope of...being saved was at last abandoned" (Acts 27:20).

But one night, in the midst of this terrifying storm, God sent an angel to Paul, who declared to him there on the ship that not only would he survive the storm, but also that all the men with him would survive as well—only the ship would be destroyed (Acts 27:23-25).

Therefore, on the fourteenth day, even while the storm still raged, an amazing scene unfolds:

As day was about to dawn, Paul urged them all to take some food, saying, "Today is the fourteenth day that you have continued in suspense and without food, having taken nothing. Therefore, I urge you to take some food. For it will give you strength, for not a hair is to perish from the head of any of you." And when he had said these things, he took bread, and giving thanks to God in the presence of all he broke it and began to eat. Then they all were encouraged and ate some food themselves. (We were in all 276 persons on the ship.) And when they had eaten enough, they lightened the ship, throwing out the wheat into the sea (Acts 27:33-38).

What a remarkable image this is! Even in the midst of this great storm, while the waves are crashing and the wind is roaring and the boat is being tossed wildly back and forth, all

the people on the ship cease their frantic labors and gather together for a meal. In the center of all the surrounding chaos, it's a scene of heavenly tranquility.

Now, this particular image has a lot to teach us Christians about our life in Christ. First, it illustrates the peace with which we can live, no matter how chaotic our circumstances may be. Think about those people on the ship. Why were they able to gather and eat in such tranquility? For one reason alone: They had a promise from God that they would be safe. As Paul assured them, not a hair of their heads would perish. Therefore, it didn't matter how bad things got. It didn't matter how intensely the storm raged. It didn't matter how high the waves mounted or how strongly the winds blew. They had God's promise. They would be safe. Therefore, no matter what was going on around them, they could eat in peace.

And it is the same for us in Christ. No, God doesn't promise us that we will be safe from bodily harm, as He promised those people on the ship; the promises He makes to us are better. First, God promises us that He will take care of all our needs as He knows best, if we seek His kingdom. As Jesus says, "Do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat, nor about your body, what you will put on... Instead seek [God's] kingdom, and these things will be added to you" (Luke 12:22, 31). But, even more, we have the promise of eternal life in our Father's kingdom: "Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32). These are God's perfect promises to us, by virtue of Christ's sacrifice, which we possess through faith.

And, on account of these promises, we can live every day with the same tranquility we see on that ship. Sure, right now things in this world seem to be getting more and more chaotic. This is true both on a global scale and on a personal scale, in each of our lives. And yet, no matter how bad things get, we don't have to be afraid. We have the assurance of God's perfect care, and of our eternal salvation. Even when our boat is tossed wildly about, we can stand firm in tranquility through Christ.

But, even more, this image illustrates the tranquility we find in the Divine Service at church. There on the ship, Paul broke bread with the people, eating a meal in peace while the storm raged around them. And that's exactly what we find in the Divine Service. There, while we gather with our brothers and sisters in Christ around the Lord's Table, eating and drinking the very body and blood of Jesus for the forgiveness of sins, God gathers us into His holy habitation, that it might

St. Mark's enjoyed a visit from missionary Joe Boway

In June, St. Mark's decided to give a tithe of \$18,000 from the sale of our back property to a Lutheran missionary named Joe Boway, who builds and supports Lutheran schools in the West African country of Liberia. Thanks be to God, this gift will provide all the funds necessary for Joe to build an entirely new seven-room schoolhouse in one of the rural towns that he serves.

On Sunday, August 1, Joe and his family visited St. Mark's. First, they joined us for worship, after which we presented to him the check (along with an additional check of \$516 collected from our VBS offerings to help purchase school supplies). Then, after the Divine Service, we gathered downstairs in the Fellowship Hall, where Joe gave a presentation on his work in Liberia.

Joe's presentation was both joyous and encouraging. He told us about what it was like for him to grow up in rural Liberia, and how the Lord brought him to faith at a young age through a missionary from Lutheran Bible Translators. He then shared how the Lord was working through those Lutheran schools, which he builds and supports, to share the good news of Jesus with many students and their families. Indeed, the Gospel is flourishing in Liberia! Afterwards, we enjoyed a luncheon with Joe and his family, organized by our Board of Parish Fellowship.

We look forward to a long-term partnership with Joe and his organization, the Liberian Childrens' Ministry! The Lutheran school which we have funded will likely be completed next fall. Before then, we hope to gather school supplies for the new school, as well as fundraise \$3,000 to dig a well. Once the school is built we expect to begin organizing mission trips to visit Liberia and help serve the people there.

Special thanks to all who made Joe's visit possible, especially those who organized the luncheon! Please keep Joe in your prayers, as well as our brothers and sisters in Christ in Liberia! (See St. Mark's Facebook page for photos.)

OPEN DOOR OUTREACH CENTER DONATIONS – We continue to receive hygiene & toiletry products year around for the Open Door Outreach Center in Waterford. There are two bins located on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can place product donations. The Open Door is a non-profit organization that assists needy families in the Lakes Area. They are ALWAYS in need of toiletry and hygiene items, so if you can provide any of these throughout the year, it would be appreciated.

USED POSTAGE STAMPS & EYEGLASSES - We continue to collect used postage stamps for Wycliffe Bible Translation Ministries, and used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in the two plastic bins on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs. Wycliffe sells the stamps to stamp collectors and then uses the proceeds to fund Bible translation projects throughout the world. MOST Ministries repairs/refurbishes used eyeglasses and distributes them via eyeglass clinics to the needy around the world. If you donate postage stamps, please be sure to leave ¼” of the envelope paper around the stamp.

DONATIONS FOR THE INVISIBLE DAD LUNCH PROGRAM - The Invisible Dad lunch program at Keith Elementary School (around the corner from St. Mark’s) was started a few years ago by a dad whose children attend there. The program keeps extra money in the school’s Invisible Dad Lunch Fund so that if a student’s personal lunch account falls too low, or if a student forgets to bring a lunch (or can’t afford to bring a lunch), money is available for them to have the same lunch as other students at no cost. This saves the student the embarrassment of being offered just a sandwich wrap and/or cheese/cracker package (the state mandated free items that the school can provide). St. Mark’s will continue to receive any loose change you might like to donate toward this program for this school year. A clear, glass jar continues to be located on the table at the back of the sanctuary where you can drop any extra change or bills you might have.
