TOILETRY/HYGIENE DONATIONS FOR THE OPEN DOOR OUTREACH CENTER

We continue to receive hygiene & toiletry products year around for the Open Door Outreach Center in Waterford. There are two bins located on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can place product donations. The Open Door is a non-profit organization that assists needy families in the Lakes Area. They are ALWAYS in need of toiletry and hygiene items, so if you can provide any of these throughout the year, it would be appreciated.

WE CONTINUE TO COLLECT used postage stamps for Wycliffe Bible Translation Ministries, and used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in the two plastic bins on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs. Wycliffe sells the stamps to stamp collectors and then uses the proceeds to translation fund Bible projects throughout the world. MOST Ministries repairs/refurbishes used eyeglasses and distributes them via eyeglass clinics to the needy around the world. If you donate postage stamps,

please leave $\frac{1}{4}$ " of the paper around the stamp.

Collecting Bottles/Cans for Ziah Town School If you would like to donate your returnable cans and bottles, the Board of Human Care is accepting them weekly! Just bring your bag to church and an usher will let you know where you can put them. A member of the Human Care Board will collect them and make the return. All money will then go into the fund for the Ziah Town Liberian Lutheran School to be used for catechisms and/or school supplies. You may also make donations at any time by either putting your check/cash in a green envelope and writing "Joe Boway" on the front (checks made payable to St. Mark's), or visiting the St. Mark's website, clicking the online giving button and selecting the fund titled Joe Boway/Liberian School.

Church Council Special Ministry Meeting Minutes December 17, 2024

Special meeting to prepare an agenda for the upcoming Special Voter's Congregational Meeting on January 12, 2025.

Attendees: John Reardon, Darryl Johnson, Karen Kaufman, Lori Whitehead, Kyle Albert

Lilli Harmon sitting in on behalf of Nancy McInnis

Guest Attendees: Pastor Dan Meckes (District Facilitator), Pastor Andrew Johnson, Circuit Visiting Pastor, Larry Whitehead (soon to be installed as Vice President of Council in 2025)

Call to Order: 7:00 p.m. and opened with prayer by Guest Pastor Dan Meckes John opened the session with a quick review of next month's calendar for approval. It was reviewed and approved as submitted.

Agenda: St. Mark's Status: 2 years Vacant Pastor.

Determining what options there are for St. Marks to take going forward.

The present Council met with Pastors' Meckes and Johnson for a round table informational review of the Options that maybe considered and whether or not St. Mark's could be in a position to entertain the ability to provide a call on a selected candidate from any of the different areas that may be offered and whether it is feasible or not. Unfortunately, after listening, the probability would be slim except one.

After a lengthy in-depth conversation as well as questions and answers session, it was determined that, unfortunately, after listening to the Pastors, the probability would be slim except one. the only feasible route would be a merger.

Reasons: Not enough Pastors/Layman graduating so those who are will be picky.

Call process takes time and may take multiple attempts for call, then there are no guarantees

The financial viability beyond the year. May not have sustainable income to ride out the process Don't have the Income to pay Pastor/Sem. Pastor along with cost of living, medical etc. Lori states that we have sustained a financial balance.

Lack of invested congregation (Boards, activities, etc.)

Active members...more likely than not, low number of attendees, less likely to have a call accepted.

This recommendation was voted on by the Council.

Conclusion: Karen Kaufman motioned to recommend Merger to Congregation.

Darryl Swainson seconded. 4 yes and 1 no.

Meeting was concluded at 8:40 p.m. with closing prayer, led by Pastor Johnson and concluded with Lord's prayer by all.
