

₩ Welcome in the name of Jesus! ★

Today we observe Septuagesima Sunday. On this day, as we begin our preparations for Lent, we consider the struggles of the Christian life and the prize that awaits us at the end. Indeed, in this world we Christians will face many difficulties. However, God promises us believers that when our time on earth is done, we will inherit eternal life through faith in Christ. Therefore, we bear all the burdens of this present life with confidence and with joy.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> here, we'd like to offer you our warmest welcome! We pray that your experience among us is blessed, and that you depart filled with God's peace and life.

Also, toward the end of our service today we will be celebrating Holy Communion, in which we will eat and drink Jesus' body and blood, under bread and wine, for the forgiveness of our sins (Matthew 26:26-28). Therefore, we ask that you would please see the statement titled "On the Sacrament of Holy Communion," printed below, which describes our beliefs and practices regarding this sacred gift.

O Lord, my creator, redeemer, and comforter, as I come to worship You in spirit and in truth, I humbly pray that You would open my heart to the preaching of Your Word so that I may repent of my sins, believe in Jesus Christ as my only Savior, and grow in grace and holiness. Hear me for the sake of His name. Amen.

ON THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION: We believe that when we receive Holy Communion together, we are publicly declaring both our unity in Christ and our agreement in doctrine (1 Cor. 10:16-17; 1 Cor. 1:10). We also believe that if we receive this sacrament in unbelief, we risk God's judgment (1 Cor. 11:27-30).

Therefore, communion at this altar is reserved for those who believe and confess the teachings of our church body, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Those who have not been formally instructed in our teachings should wait to commune until completing a course of instruction with us.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> and would like to commune with us today, please speak with the pastor before the service. If you will not be communing, you are welcome to kneel at the altar with your arms folded across your chest to receive a blessing, or you may simply remain in your pew.







Holy Gospel Matthew 20:1–16

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twentieth chapter.



¹[Jesus said:] "The kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. ²After agreeing with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. ³And going out about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the marketplace, ⁴and to them he said, 'You go into the

vineyard too, and whatever is right I will give you.' ⁵So they went. Going out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour, he did the same. ⁶And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing. And he said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' ⁷They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You go into the vineyard too.' ⁸And when evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the laborers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last, up to the first.' ⁹And when those hired about the eleventh hour came, each of them received a denarius. ¹⁰Now when those hired first came, they thought they would receive more, but each of them also received a denarius. ¹¹And on receiving it they grumbled at the master of the house, ¹²saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' ¹³But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? ¹⁴Take what belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. ¹⁵Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?' ¹⁶So the last will be first, and the first last."




Prayer of the Church

ASH WEDNESDAY & MIDWEEK LENTEN WORSHIP SERVICES — We are happy to report that St. Mark's WILL be hosting its annual Ash Wednesday Divine Service here on **Wednesday**, **February 14** at 7:00 p.m. Pastor Pies will be our presiding minister that evening and he will be offering the Imposition of Ashes to those who wish to receive them. The subsequent midweek Lenten services will be held at our 3 sister churches—Peace Waterford, Faith Highland, and Christ Milford—at 7:00 p.m. The pastors of those congregations will be rotating in a round-robin style and parishioners will be encouraged to select ONE location to attend so that they get to see/hear all 3 pastors preach over the 5 week Lenten period. Please make plans now to attend all of these Lenten worship services!

LENTEN COIN HOLDERS - The season of Lent officially begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14. Once again, we will be receiving cash donations via our Lenten Coin Folders that will be located on the table in the entryway soon. This year's coin folder donations will be going toward the Ziah Town Lutheran School Fund as we continue to help missionary, Joe Boway, provide catechism books and other needed supplies to the students there. How do the folders work? Just place one quarter each day during Lent into the corresponding slot (excluding Sundays, which are celebrated as "mini Easters" and are IN Lent, but not OF Lent), and by Easter Sunday, your holder will be full and equal \$10! Then, you can place your full folder into any offering plate on Easter Sunday or before. Collecting quarters is an easy and fun activity to do, especially for kids!

PASTORAL CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE - On Wednesday, January 17, St. Mark's Call Committee met with Pastor Meckes from the Michigan District LCMS to discuss the next steps to be taken to find a possible dual parish pastor. Pastor Meckes plans to check with the LCMS' English District to discuss the possibility of us looking at area English District churches too. This would expand our LCMS congregation pastoral search options. In the meantime, the committee will be getting together soon to discuss what St. Mark's needs would be for a dual parish pastor.

LENTEN DEVOTION BOOKS - As you prepare for Lent, we hope you will grab a copy of the Lenten Devotional Booklets provided to us by Lutheran Hour Ministries that will be located on the table at the rear of the sanctuary soon. These booklets offer scripture readings and devotions for each day during Lent. They make for excellent reading during this penitential season! We thank Lutheran Hour Ministries for making the booklets available to us free of charge, and hope they will enhance your Lenten studies.

GREETING CARD DONATIONS NEEDED - St. Mark's Board of Human Care has a Greeting Card Ministry that they would like to expand! This past year they have taken 5 batches of cards to MediLodge in Milford, where their staff give them to their residents who they feel can benefit from a friendly greeting. If you have any cards, either blank inside, Christmas, Easter, Valentine, 4th of July, etc... and especially general "thinking of you" type, and would like to donate them, there is now a box on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can put them. Also, any stickers or cut outs that can be used to decorate blank cards would be very useful. These cards can be secular or religious. All money will then go into the fund for the Ziah Town Liberian Lutheran School to be used for catechisms and/or school supplies. You may also make donations at any time by either putting your check/cash in a green envelope and writing "Joe Boway" on the front (checks made payable to St. Mark's), or visiting the St. Mark's website, clicking on the online giving button and selecting the fund titled Joe Boway/Liberian School.

TOILETRY/HYGIENE DONATIONS FOR THE OPEN DOOR OUTREACH CENTER — We continue to receive hygiene & toiletry products year around for the Open Door Outreach Center in Waterford. There are two bins located on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can place product donations. The Open Door is a non-profit organization that assists needy families in the Lakes Area. They are ALWAYS in need of toiletry and hygiene items, so **if you can provide any of these throughout the year, it would be appreciated.**

WE CONTINUE TO COLLECT used postage stamps for Wycliffe Bible Translation Ministries, and used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in the two plastic bins on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs. Wycliffe sells the stamps to stamp collectors and then uses the proceeds to fund Bible translation projects throughout the world. MOST Ministries repairs/refurbishes used eyeglasses and distributes them via eyeglass clinics to the needy around the world. If you donate postage stamps, please leave ¼" of the paper around the stamp.
