#### Voters' Meeting Minutes—Summarized December 3, 2023

Called to order at 10:45 a.m. Opening Prayer/Devotion by Pastor Pies

Vice President's Report—The Young Adults group met on December 2. Lower attendance than usual.

#### **Board Reports**

Elders: They are working with Pastor Tkac from Peace re: confirmands; Larry Whitehead continues to write/mail birthday, anniversary and visitor postcards; still working with the Call Committee.

Gospel Outreach per John Reardon: waiting for new pastor to be called so he can work with this board; suggestion made to check with Pastor Zwonitzer re: the congregation Revitality process.

Human Care per Karen Kaufman: continuing to collect bottles/cans for Ziah Town Lutheran School in Liberia; they are writing/mailing cards to an area nursing home; St. Mark's to serve dinner at St. Paul, Pontiac in May 2024.

LWML per Leslie Oehring: made 40 quilts for Lutheran World Relief this year; 4 St. Mark's ladies attended the Fall Zone Rally; LWML dues are caught up.

Parish Fellowship per Nancy McInnis: oversaw the Fall Harvest Potluck; will help with Wed. Nights in Christ next fall; Ash Wed. Soup & Salad Supper will depend on if we get a pastor before then.

Properties: bought a new commercial lawn mower in 2023, need volunteers to mow again in 2024; the parking lot cracks have been filled; discussed current water leak, suggestion was made to replace the men's room toilet, also the 2 main water valves that don't work.

#### Misc. Business Items

2024 Election Slate—approved as submitted.

Call Committee Update: met with a sister LCMS church re: a possible dual parish, but that didn't work out. Met with another sister LCMS church re: them "leasing" us one of their extra pastors at 50% shared cost, but that didn't work out. St. Mark's completed the congregation surveys and received a pastor Call List containing 11 candidates. Trent presented details re: St. Mark's current budget concerns.

A question was then posed to voters: *should the Call Committee continue moving forward with calling a full-time pastor considering St. Mark's budget*

and the average age of our church members? A paper ballot vote ensued: 21 voted NO; 2 voted YES; 1 abstained. Therefore, this option was dropped.

The remaining 3 options were then voted on: *look into a dual parish situation, look into merging with a sister congregation, remain in a permanent vacancy status utilizing vacancy pastors going forward.* A paper ballot vote ensued: 16—Dual Parish; 3 Merge; 5 Remain in Permanent Vacancy. The majority was DUAL PARISH, so that's what the Call Committee will pursue.

2024 Budget was approved with a part-time pastor's salary & benefits and also a part-time secretary.

Meeting was adjourned at 12:10 p.m. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Call to order at 7:01 pm

Opening Prayer

Previous minutes accepted as submitted.

<u>Vice President's Report</u> per Trent Johnson – Trivia Night for the young adults has been set for December 2 from 4-8 pm. Dinner will be served. The Trivia Night is at St. Mark's.

#### **BOARD REPORTS**

Elders per Trent Johnson -

- Confirmation has begun for four students with Pastor Tkac being available for the students to call with questions and he will administer the Unit Check-ins. Dillon and Riley O'Brien were baptized by Pastor Pies on Sunday, November 19.
- Thanksgiving Day worship service will be held at Our Savior, Hartland at 10 am on November 23.

- Call Committee Update The Call Committee received a pastoral Call List from our Michigan District on November 14. The Committee met that evening to discuss and summarize the pastoral "options" research that has been completed to date. The Committee has decided to pause the call process until they present the four pastoral call options to the voter's assembly at the Voters' Meeting on December 3 and the voters can decide which direction they would like to go.

The four options are: Call a Pastor Dual Parish Merger Perpetual Vacancy

Lori Whitehead brought up about reaching out to the folks who are not coming to church. This was discussed at the planning meeting in September. Perhaps this should be the Gospel Outreach group calling folks and try to persuade them to come back to church. We need to do something to get attendance back up.

Human Care per Karen Kaufman -

- Adopt-A-Family program through the Open Door, Waterford. The sign-up sheet is in the lobby. St. Mark's was given four people to buy for.
- Greeting Cards for area nursing homes need donations of various greeting cards, stickers, etc. A box is located in the bookshelf area for card donations.
- The next St. Paul Dinner will be on Wednesday, May 29.

Properties per Trent Johnson, Debbie LoCascio and Lori Whitehead -

- Annual Boiler Inspection was completed. We passed and the paperwork was submitted to the state.
- Lori Whitehead sent an email to the committee regarding KCA Paving not responding to her calls and emails. She asked for approval to hire HD Sealcoating & Paving and Tom LoCascio and Trent Johnson approved it. They will be out to do the job on Wednesday, November 22, 2023.
- Lori Whitehead talked to the plumber and he will not be able to get to us until the first week of December.
- The Plexiglas in the sanctuary windows will be fixed as soon as the ladder can be accessed. There was something wrong with the lock and no one could get to the ladder. The crank windows will be taken care of in the Spring.
- The list of projects is working out well.

LWML per Debbie LoCascio for Leslie Oehring – the Quilting Bee is on hiatus until February 2024.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Church office will be closed for Thanksgiving on November 23 and 24.
- We will decorate for Christmas on Saturday, November 25 at 10:00 am.
- The Semi-Annual Voters' Meeting will be Sunday, December 3 after service. All voting will be by paper ballot. No council meeting in December.
- Sarah Dwyer has expressed an interest in the Church Secretary's job. She will be meeting with Debbie LoCascio the week after Thanksgiving to discuss further.
- Election Slate we will be voting on this at the Semi-Annual Voters' Meeting on December 3.
- Distribution of 2024 Budget everyone received two copies of the 2024 budget—one included the
  cost for a full-time pastor and the second included the cost for a part-time pastor (or dual parish pastor).

Discussion ensued: After going through the budget, Council decided to remove \$76 for the Easter Door Hangers.

Properties' costs have gone up mainly due to increased gas and electric bills. We are saving some on lawn care as we purchased a lawn mower in 2023. Lori Whitehead offered to check on health insurance to try and get closer to an actual cost. Budget was approved for submittal to the voters' assembly on December 3.

• The council acknowledges and thanks Tom LoCascio for his service as St. Mark's President these past 6 years. This will be his last council meeting.

Next council meeting will be Tuesday, January 16, 2024, at 7 pm.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:00 pm. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
