Pastor's Page

A Kingdom that Cannot Be Shaken

My friends, we are living in chaotic and uncertain times. At home our nation is in turmoil. Our political divisions at the state and federal levels are sharp and increasingly hostile. Our national debt is ballooning out of control. Our governing authorities are regularly deadlocked. Our culture is drifting farther and farther away from traditional, Biblical morality. Prices of goods are skyrocketing, crime is becoming more prevalent, and people everywhere are struggling—in mind, in body, and in spirit.

And when we turn our eyes beyond our national boundaries and gaze out into the world at large, things appear just as bleak. A worldwide pandemic has just brought devastation into every corner of the globe. International trade has been disrupted. Alliances are shifting. War has broken out in Eastern Europe, spilling images of ruin across our screens. Refugees are fleeing. Tyrants are on the march. Famines are raging. Indeed, the entire world order seems to be tottering.

And when we see all this, where does it lead us? Often we're left trembling with anxiety and utterly discouraged. We wonder: What kind of world will our children inherit? Will our nation survive? What about our freedoms? Will we soon be embroiled in another World War? What's going to happen to my savings if prices keep going up? How will things change for my family? Am I going to have to give up on some of my dreams? How are we going to make it through all of this? Such questions can plague us when we look at the world today, and certainly the devil is happy to keep them bouncing around in our minds.

But in these times, when so much is changing and chaos has spread across the globe, God calls us to remember what He says in the book of Hebrews: "Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire" (Hebrews 12:28-29). Yeah, this is what we have in Christ. We have a kingdom that cannot be shaken! And whenever the chaos of the world would cause us to despair, God calls us to remember that.

The truth is that the Day of God's wrath is coming, when He will "shake not only the earth but also the heavens" (Hebrews 12:26). On that day, the whole world will be destroyed, with all kingdoms and all powers, on account of sin. Just as God once destroyed the world by water in the days of Noah, so He will on the Last Day destroy all things by fire (2 Peter 3:7). We don't know when this Day will be

(Matthew 24:36), but it will all be fulfilled when Christ returns again in glory.

And as that Day draws near, Christ has warned that chaos and evil will only increase. Many will be led astray (Matthew 24:5). You will hear of wars and rumors of wars (Matthew 24:6). There will be famines and earthquakes in various places (Matthew 24:7). The Church will be persecuted (Matthew 24:9). False prophets will arise (Matthew 24:11). And the love of many will grow cold (Matthew 24:12). We see all these things in the world today, don't we? And they're all reminders that the great Day of Wrath is approaching, when the heavens and the earth will be shaken to their very foundations by the God who is a "consuming fire" (Hebrews 12:29).

But praise be to God that in Christ you have a kingdom that cannot be shaken! Jesus won this for you by suffering the full wrath of God on the cross and enduring there the destruction that you deserved. There the long-awaited Christ was "shaken" in your place. And now, rising again from the dead, He has opened the way for you to return to God and become a part of His eternal kingdom. This is God's free gift to you through faith. He gives it to you in your baptism, and seals it upon you in Holy Communion. Through faith, you have been taken out of the kingdom of this world and made a part of the kingdom of God's Son (Colossians 1:13). You are now citizens of heaven (Philippians 3:20).

And we rejoice today, and worship God acceptably, with reverence and awe, because He proclaims to us an amazing truth about this kingdom: It cannot be shaken! Yeah, our current world is passing away. Every day we see just how shakable it is. All things here are uncertain and incomplete. But we are now citizens of an unshakable kingdom! Nothing can take away Christ and His salvation. Nothing can take away God's love toward us in Him. Nothing can take away the resurrection from the dead, or our perfect life with our Creator in the new heavens and new earth. It is all unshakable. And as baptized believers we can stand firmly upon all of it.

What does that mean? It means that no matter how much chaos we may see, no matter how uncertain our world might be, we have no reason to be discouraged. We have no reason to fear. Yeah, our nation may find itself embroiled in turmoil. Our world may totter and fall. But we can always remember—and must always remember—that we have Jesus and His kingdom. We can let all else pass away. We can stand immovably in the spirit. We can abide in love. We can worship in joy. For our kingdom is unshakable, just like our Savior, risen from the dead.
